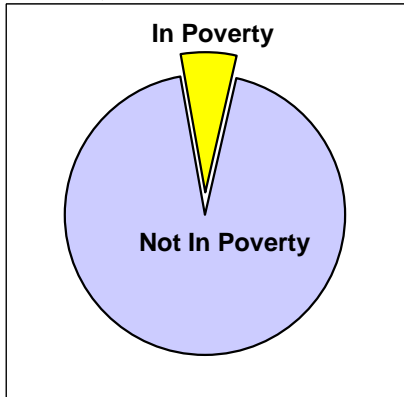

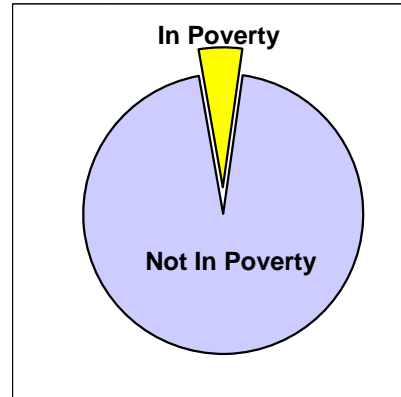
#### Children Under Age 18 in Poverty
